

BYLAWS OF THE WAKEFIELD HIGH SCHOOL
BLOCKCHAIN AND CRYPTOCURRENCY CLUB

ARTICLE 1: NAME OF ORGANIZATION

The name of the organization shall be the Blockchain and Cryptocurrency Club.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

1.1 Increase awareness of emerging blockchain technologies and their impacts on various industries, including healthcare, gaming/metaverse, financial services, energy, transportation/logistics, and others.

1.2 Provide a collaborative environment in which students can share information and learn about new applications of blockchain and related technologies.

1.3 Provide a positive forum in which students can be innovative and share their ideas about blockchain technology and its uses.

1.4 Promote Wakefield High School and its students by encouraging club members to interact with the community and organizations utilizing blockchain and related technologies, write and publish articles (for the club website or outside publications), and provide networking opportunities for potential internships or other future opportunities for members.

ARTICLE III: MEETINGS

The club shall hold regular, monthly meetings at such time and place as shall be determined by the club with the approval of the principal.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

1.1 Membership is open to any currently enrolled Wakefield High School student.

1.2 Membership is open to any current faculty or staff member at Wakefield High School.

1.3 Only currently enrolled students are allowed to run for club offices.

1.4 Current members may bring up new business during the open floor session of regularly scheduled meetings.

ARTICLE V: DUES

This club does not require dues.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

1.1 Officers shall be president, vice president, secretary and webmaster (or technology officer). They shall serve for one (1) year or until their successors are elected and qualify.

1.2 Each officer shall be a member in good standing. No other restrictions or limitations shall be placed on these officers.

1.3 The president shall preside over all regular and special meetings of the club. The president, with input from the other officers, shall approve the format and content of the club's website, including approval of articles or other

content to be published on the site. The president shall maintain regular communication with the club sponsor and the high school administration, as necessary.

1.4 The vice president shall succeed the office of the president in the event of the resignation or removal of the president for whatever reason and, in the absence of the president, shall preside over all meetings of the club.

1.5 The secretary shall maintain all club records and minutes of all meetings of the club.

1.6 The webmaster (or technology officer) shall oversee the creation and maintenance of the club website in cooperation with the president and club sponsor.

ARTICLE VII: ELECTIONS

1.1 Election of new officers (president, vice president, secretary, and webmaster/technology officer) should be held at the meeting in February each year and they should take office in May.

1.2 All officers who are members in good standing shall be eligible for re-election.

ARTICLE VIII: ACTIVITIES, PROJECTS, AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

1.1 Publish articles relating to innovations or applications of blockchain and related technologies.

1.2 Discuss non-fungible tokens (NFTs) and how they can be created and/or utilized by members and the community.

1.3 Invite guest speakers from local business leaders in blockchain technology to educate members and develop potential connections for future internship or other opportunities.

1.4 Identify videos, articles or other educational resources to be shared and/or discussed during meetings.
